Our curriculum framework is based on the Waldorf curriculum, which is used in Camphill and Steiner-Waldorf Schools across the world. Ours is a blended curriculum, as it also takes into account the Programmes of Study and attainment targets set out in the Northern Ireland Curriculum and the Q Skills Framework.

Themes from the Waldorf Curriculum are offered in daily Morning Lesson blocks of four to six weeks.
